Union of India, the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh is pleased to order that the Director General of Police, Arunachal Pradesh shall be selected by the State Government from a panel of three senior -most officers who have been empanelled for promotion to that rank by the Union Public Service Commission on the basis of their length of service, very good record and range of experience for heading the police force. The State Security Commission is being constituted to ensure that the State Government does not exercise unwarranted influence or pressure on the State Police and for laying down the broad policy guidelines so that the State Police always acts according to the laws of the land and the constitution of the country. The function of this Commission would therefore include laying down the broad policies and giving directions for the performance of the preventive tasks and service oriented functions of the police, evaluation of the performance of the State Police and preparing a report thereon for being placed before the State Legislature.

No. HMB (A)-23/06(Pt-V).— In compliance with the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the Writ petition (Civil) No. 310 of 1996 Prakash Singh and others Vs. Union of India, the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh is pleased to constitute Police Complaints Authorities (1) at the District level in Arunachal Pradesh to look into the complaints against police officers of and upto the rank of Deputy Superintendent of police and (2) at the State level to look into complaints against officers of the rank of Superintendent of Police and above.

The District Police Complaint Authority shall be headed by a retired District Judge, chosen by the State Government out of a panel of names proposed by the Chief Justice or a Judge of the High Court nominated by him and the State Police Complaint Authority shall be headed by a retired Judge of High Court/Supreme Court, chosen by the State Government out of a panel of names proposed by the Chief Justice. These authorities shall be assisted by three to five members depending upon the volume of complaints in the State/different districts, and they shall be selected by the State Government from a panel prepared by the State Human Rights Commission/Lok Ayukta/State Public Service Commission. The panel shall include members from amongst retired civil servants, police/officers from other department, or from the civil society. They would work whole time for the authority and would have to be remunerated for the service rendered by them. For the purpose of regular staff to conduct field enquiries these authorities may utilize the services of retired investigator from the CID, Intelligence, Vigilance or any other organization.

The State level Complaints Authority would take cognizance of only allegations of serious misconduct by the police personnel, which would include incidents involving death, grievous hurt or rape in police custody. The District level Complaints Authority would, apart from above cases, may also inquire into allegations of extortion, land/house grabbing or any incident involving serious abuse of authority. The recommendation of the

Complaints Authority, both at the district and state level, for any action, departmental or criminal, against a delinquent police officer shall be binding on the concerned authority.

The term for the chairperson/members of the State/District Police Complaint Authority should be of four years not exceeding two terms.

Since complaints against the police are very few in this state, the districts are clubbed into seven regions for the purpose of District Police Complaint Authorities in Arunachal Pradesh, as shown below :

1. Bomdila — having jurisdiction over Tawang, East Kameng and West Kameng.
2. Papumpare — having jurisdiction over Papumpare.
3. Ziro — having jurisdiction over Upper and Lower Subansiri and Kurung Kumey.
4. Pasighat — having jurisdiction over East, West and Upper Siang.
5. Roing — having jurisdiction over Lower and Upper Dibang Valley.
6. Tezu — having jurisdiction over Anjaw and Lohit.
7. Miao — having jurisdiction over Changlang and Tirap.
