No. FOR. 220/IND/2005/ROYALTY/14400-500.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 34(2) (h) of the Assam Forest Regulation 1891 (VII of 1891) read with the State of Arunachal Pradesh Adaptation of law order (No. 2) 1988, the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh is pleased to prescribe rates of royalty as below on Forest produce collected from any land/forest at the disposal of Government of Arunachal Pradesh. The revised rates of royalty shall come into effect from the date of issue of this Notification in the official Gazette.

2. The timber species for rates of royalty are classified into ten classes as given in the last para.

3.1. Royalty of timber

The rates of royalty on round timber per cum. for various classes of species shall be as under :-

Mid girth over bark shall be measured at the middle of the log. For logs above 365 Cms in length mid-girth however will be measured at 183 Cm from butt end. The cubic content of log will be calculated by multiplying square of quarter girth with length of log i.e. $(G/4) 2 \times L = \text{Volume}$.

For debarked log, the rates will be ten per cent higher and for dressed log, the rates will be thirty three per cent higher than the above rates. Rates for sawn timber will be double the above rates for logs having mid girth however "122 Cm and above".

3.2. Rates of royalty on poles.

The poles are round timber with less than 61 cm girth over bark at mid point. The rates are in rupees (Rs.) per piece.

For debarked poles, the rates will be ten per cent higher and for dressed poles the rate will be thirty three per cent higher than above rates. Length of poles in fraction of half meter or more will be taken into the next higher numerical unit of length in assessment of royalty.

Wood less than one meter in length and below 60 cm in girth (O.B.) will be classed as Firewood. Wood of higher girth owing to hollowness, crookedness or any other defects unsuitable for sawing into scantlings, planks, beam and also for peeling etc. may be allowed to be removed as firewood only after splitting under supervision of the Forest Department.

4. All other Minor Forest Produces not listed above will be charged at twelve and half per cent i.e. 12.5% "Advalorem" of the market rate as approved/fixed by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Arunachal Pradesh, for all forest areas/land irrespective of ownership of the land except in cases where specific Government order exists for removal of forest produce without realization of royalty.

No. DAD-48/S&R/07.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 78 of the Registration Act, 1908 (Act No. 16 of 1908), the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh is pleased to amend the Arunachal Pradesh Registration Rules, 1993, notified vide No. Tax-7/77 dated 18th March, 1993, except as respect things done or omitted to be done before such amendment, as under namely :—

1. These Rules may be called the Arunachal Pradesh Registration (Amendment) Rules, 2007.
2. They shall extend to whole of Arunachal Pradesh.
3. They shall come into force with immediate effect.
4. (i) Omission of sub-rule (b) and (e) of Rule 2 : In the Arunachal Pradesh Registration Rules, 1993 (hereinafter referred to as Principal Rules), the sub-rule (b) and (e) of Rule 2, shall be omitted.
- (ii) Amendment of sub-rule (f) of Rule 2 : In the Principal Rules for sub-rule (f) of rule 2, the following shall be substituted, namely “(f) “Section” means section of the Registration Act, 1908 (Act No. 16 of 1908).
- (iii) Addition of sub-rules : In the Principal Rules, after sub-rule (f) of Rule 2, the following shall be added, namely :—
- “(g)“ Ordinary fees” means fee of the registration of documents regulated on an advelorem scale and calculated according to value of right, title and interest affected.
- (h) “Conveyance” means an instrument (document) whereby property, movable or immovable is transferred by way of sale or otherwise.
- (i) “Re-conveyance” means mortgage by Conditional Sale or an instrument where re-conveyance of property is necessary optional.
- (j) “Further Charge” means an instrument imposing a further charge on mortgage property”.
5. Amendment of Table of fees : In the Principal Rules, for the heading “TABLE OF FEES” the following shall be substituted, namely :—

I-ORDINARY FEES

The fees of the registration of documents described below are regulated on an advalorem scale and calculated according to the value of right, title and interest affected.

 - (v) He will also conduct cases before the Central Administrative Tribunal, Guwahati and other courts in representing the Government of Arunachal Pradesh in the matter relating to the State of Arunachal Pradesh and perform such functions as may be assigned by the Government.

No. JUD-31/87 (A).—In exercise of the powers conferred by the Article 165 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh is pleased to appoint Shri Nilay Dutta, Senior Advocate, Gauhati High Court, Gawahati as the Advocate General for the State of Arunachal Pradesh with immediate effect and such appointment shall be subject to the following terms and conditions :

1. **Fees :** For the performance of duties the Advocate General shall be paid such fees and shall be entitled to such other facilities as prescribed vide Government Notification No. LAW/JUD-32/2005 dated 27th March, 2006.

2. **Duties :** The Advocate General shall, in addition to the functions conferred on him by or under the Constitution of India or any other law for the time being in force and such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Government, discharge the following duties and functions :

- (i) advice on legislative measures, rules and bye-laws pending before the State Government and on Bills of the Union sent to him for opinion ;
- (ii) examine and draft plaints, pleadings and writen statements in important Government cases when so required by the Government ;
- (iii) advise upon any matters upon which he is consulted by the Government particularly in contracts/ leases/agreements/purchases of lands/buildings where Government interest and financial implications are involved ;
- (iv) furnish the Governor/the Chief Minister with written opinion in respect of proceedings and on all other matters on which such written opinion may be required ;
- (v) conduct cases before the Principal Bench/outlying Bench of the Gauhati High Court in Arunachal Pradesh at the instance of Government in appeals in both civil and criminal and other cases ;
- (vi) appear in the Supreme Court in all cases (civil, Criminal and others) to which the Government are a party or in which, although, not themselves a party they find it necessary to order a watching brief ;
- (vii) apply to the Court in all suits and appeals conducted by him to which the Government are a party and in which the decisions are adverse to the Government, on the very date of delivery of judgement for a copy of it and to forward such a copy to the Government without delay ;
- (viii) forward a copy of the judgement to the Government for information of the date before which further action, if any, should be taken;
- (ix) report to the Government as soon as possible advisability of appealing against a decision ;
- (x) perform such other duties of a legal character as may be referred or assigned to him by the Governor from time to time ;
- (xi) report to the Government of any flaw in legal enactment and any facts arising therefrom or in connection with cases conducted by him which he thinks, or the High Court desires, should be brought to the notice of the Government ;
- (xii) bring to the notice of the Government any case in which the High Court, in confirming or imposing a minimum legal penalty would serve the ends of justice ;
- (xiii) to protect public rights in such matters as public charities and public nuisances ;

3. The Advocate General, as a condition of his services, is debarred from :-

- (i) defending accused persons in criminal prosecutions unless permitted by the Governor ;
- (ii) advising private parties in cases in which he is likely to be called on to advise Government ;
- (iii) accepting brief from a legal practitioner or other person concerned in a case under the Legal Practitioners Act, without ascertaining whether his service will be required by the Governor in that case ;
- (iv) appearing in any appeals against the orders for the settlement of any lease, contract or for the grant of permits issued by the Government, or any officer of authority under Government ;
- (v) accepting appointment as a Director in any Company without the sanction of the Governor.

Provided and subject to the above, his private practice does not interfere with the efficient discharge of his official duties, the Advocate General will be permitted to practice without restriction.
